Youth and young adults will also have special opportunities to be involved. "Rejuvenate '10" will have worship, workshops, and time to connect with church leaders, and discover their gifts for ministry in Christ's name.

Continued focus on the Bishop's Initiative to Eliminate Hunger – Change Hunger Fast will lift up ways our local churches are addressing hunger needs in their communities. As a joint effort, every congregation is encouraged to collect change (coins or paper) to bring to Annual Conference which then will be used to award grants for starting new or expanding hunger ministries.

These are just a few of the activities taking place at Annual Conference. There will also be time for exciting worship, seeing old friends and making new ones. Your prayers for Bishop Hoshibata, Conference leaders and attendees, and especially for our delegates is especially welcomed. Stay tuned for reports when Kelley, Eva and I return.

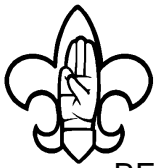
The Team consists of 35 youth and adults. They will be staying in our church facility and joining us in worship on June 27 after which there will be an all-church potluck to formally welcome them.

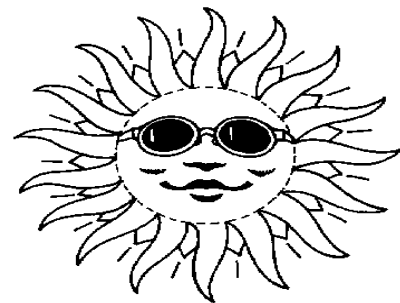

District Extension Report

The South Coast District Extension Society (SCDES) helps start new churches and/or ministries, strengthens existing churches, and gives assistance for repairs or improvements to local church congregations. It is funded by \$2.00 per person district wide, and is administered by a committee consisting of the pastor and a lay person from each church. They meet twice a year to consider requests and allocate funds.

In May, they granted \$100.00 to Wilderville, which had suffered a seven inch basement flood when a pipe broke in the night. They could not collect insurance until the deductible was met. They lost all their rummage inventory, which not only provides some monthly income, but also serves people there and in the surrounding area.

Talent needs considerable work on their building, but the most urgent was new doors for security purposes, for which \$350.00 was granted.

Upper Rogue needs a new roof for which \$930.00 was allowed and they are authorized to seek \$20.00 club contributions.

Last November a new interchurch youth ministry was authorized and \$500.00 was added for that outreach.
